HEC Alumni Prepares Its White Paper on Biodiversity



Alan Jope, CEO of Unilever, at HEC Talks: "Today, consumers don't just care about products"

After former Best Buy CEO Hubert Joly in January, HEC Talks welcomed a new icon of the world's largest companies: Alan Jope, CEO of Unilever. The audience in the Blondepou amphitheater was first able to measure the importance of the group he leads: present in 90 countries with nearly 150,000 employees, with some thirty brands, its products are used by 3.4 billion people, or nearly ... half of humanity. "Big Business" therefore, but which entails immense responsibilities, according to Alan Jope, whose clear, inspired and humorous speech was particularly appreciated. "Purpose-led, future-fit: business in the 21st century": the theme chosen for this conference was above all an opportunity to discover Unilever's strong commitment and very concrete actions, for several years, in favor of sustainable development and CSR.

A new "Climate & Business" certificate for HEC students

As of May 2, HEC students will be able to take part in the new "Climate & Business" certificate offered by the S&O Institute's Climate & Earth Center. Its objective: to prepare students to face the challenges of climate change and the decarbonization of our economies, with a dual business and societal perspective.

Taking place over five weeks, the certificate program aims to understand how to move towards zero net greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. Each week is devoted to one of the five core elements (understanding, decarbonizing, financing, experimenting, and engaging) that will enable students to become agents of change, and contribute to limiting the global temperature increase to 1.5°C, as recommended by climate scientists. The courses will be taught on the HEC campus by high-level speakers from the academic world, companies, financial institutions, governments and NGOs. Students will also have the opportunity to spend a week on the Transition campus at Domaine de Forges.
